We decided which plants were weeds and which were savers, then pulled, dug and eliminated the weeds. We marked the volunteer trees for removal, and shoveled dirt that had accumulated off the walk. We cleaned out the beds, but there is much more to be done. Noreen

identified plant and tree volunteers with tape. Carolyn pruned the much overgrown trumpet vine on the arbor. Carmine and Diane worked on the weeds in the beds. Tom and Collin cut down and trimmed bushes and volunteer trees. Tom weed-whacked the fountain area of weeds. Judy worked on the north side garden, pulling weeds and

overgrowth, filling several garbage carts, and she did it in the HOT SUN! We all enjoyed discovering plants that we did not know and looking them up on plant websites.

The path can now be walked without having to avoid things reaching out and grabbing you. This serene sanctuary is located south of the house across the driveway. In order to do this, we need to interact with community members both past and present to discover, interview, collect stories, and artifacts, a task which our Curator, Susan Kroll, and the Museum Committee undertakes. Among their many tasks, volunteers examine the contents of the boxes of historical items stored in our archives. The artifacts are acquired and catalogued with an identifying number, donor information and description and history. Photos are scanned. Collections, as important as they are, need to be properly identified, documented and stored in order to be exhibited and tell their stories. In addition, docents greet visitors to the house every Saturday. We are currently looking for several volunteers to become regular docents and assistants.
