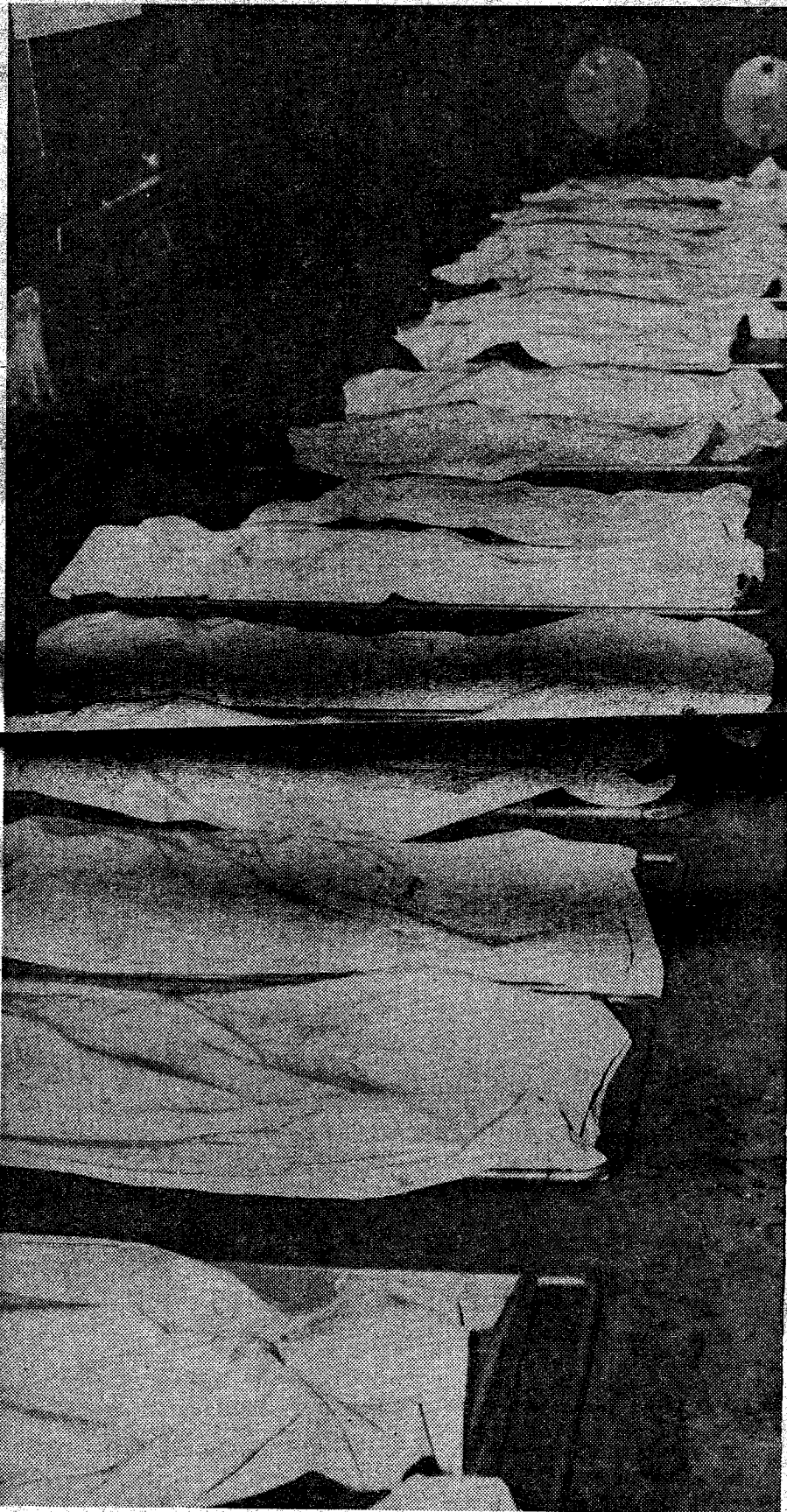

90 DIE IN FIRE School Toll City's Worst In 55 Years

87 children.

And three of the nuns who were their teachers. That, as near as any informed person could tell, was the terrible arithmetic of the fire that swept Our Lady of the Angels school at 3820 W. Iowa Monday just 18 minutes before the day's final schoolbell.

It was Chicago's worst fire toll since the Iroquois Theater disaster of 1903, which claimed 602 lives.

Monday's school blaze, like the Iroquois fire, stunned the city and the nation.

In addition to the dead, the fire's victims included scores of cruelly injured youngsters. They were burned or badly hurt while leaping in terror from the blazing two-story building. At least 100 in all were injured.

Hours after the fire broke out in midafternoon the cause of the
